The Pastor's Perspective Dr. Reggie Bridges

I would have despaired unless I had believed that I would see the goodness of the LORD . . . Wait for the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage (Psalm 27:13-14 NASB).

There are some days when even ministers are given to despair. Days when we seek to encourage those facing physical difficulties, assist those encountering family strife, and comfort those sorrowing from death's effects. Recently, such moments surrounded me, and I found myself in despair's grip. It was then that my thoughts to turned back to a daily devotion that God has used in my life before. The Scripture upon which it focused? You guessed it: Psalm 27:13-14. Listen to the following excerpt from the devotion:

Do not despair! Oh, how great the temptation is to despair at times! Our soul becomes depressed and disheartened, and our faith staggers under severe trials and testing that come into our lives, especially during times of bereavement and suffering. We may come to the place where we say 'I cannot bear this any longer. I am close to despair under these circumstances God has allowed. He tells me not to despair, but what am I supposed to do when I am at this point?' . . . Once you have come close to the point of despair, God's message is not, 'Be strong and courageous' (Joshua 1:6), for He knows that your strength and courage have run away. Instead, He says sweetly, 'Be still, and know that I am God' (Psalm 46:10). . . . That is all God

asks of you as His dear child. When you become weak through the fierce fires of affliction, do not try to 'be strong.' Just 'be still, and know that [He is] God." And know that He will sustain you and bring you though the fire. . . . Be strong and take heart (Taken from Streams in the Desert, 188-189).

When I read these words, it appeared as if God had known exactly what I was going through and that He had spoken directly to me. And then reality set in. The Lord DID know what I was experiencing, and He WAS sending me a message! He was instructing me to stop and take strength in Him.

Often, that is all we can do. Instead of struggling against the circumstances of the day, we simply rest ourselves in Christ and allow Him to refresh us. His presence reenergizes us to emerge the next day with a renewed commitment to His Kingdom. In addition, we look forward to better days ahead. We realize that the moment of crisis is temporary as we are confident that God has something much greater prepared for us believers. No need to despair! Just look ahead! And join the Psalmist's proclamation: I would have despaired unless I had believed that I would see the goodness of the LORD!

My friends, I look forward to seeing you Sunday (don't forget to set your clock back one hour) as we collectively recognize the goodness of the Lord! My prayer is that He will encourage strength and boldness in us as we rest in Him! See you then!

Get to Know Generation Z

Gen Z is the newest generation to be named. They were born between 1997 and 2012/15. They are currently between 8-23 years old (nearly 68 million in U.S.)

Here are some fun facts to keep in mind when thinking about our current youth and Generation Z:

- They have never been a part of a world without the internet.
- The average age for receiving their first cell phone is 10.6 years of age.
- They navigate multiple screens (phones, computer, television, and more) simultaneously.
- With the growing diversity of our United States population, this will be the last majority white (52%) generation. Diversity is their normal. 22% of Generation Z have at least one immigrant parent.
- They are less likely to smoke, drink alcohol, and use illegal drugs than previous generations.
- Even with all the ways they connect virtually, they are lonely. There has been an increase every year in depression and anxiety in high school students since 2012.
- 68% say they feel overwhelmed by the things they feel they need to do each week.
- 72% of older Generation Z students say they want to start their own business.
- Personalization of products and individualized marketing is normal to them and expected by them.

Here are some particularly interesting facts to me as a youth minister:

- In 1966, 6.6% of college freshmen did not identify with any religion. In 2019, over 30% did not claim any religious affiliation.
- 80% say they believe in a "God or universal spirit."
- They are the least likely generation to tune in to a virtual worship service.

What this means is that they want to believe in something, but they don't know what to believe. They don't want another person on a screen telling them what to believe; they want a personal conversation about it. This is a generation that is starving for genuine friends and genuine conversation about real issues like what they believe.

I'm excited that I get to minister to this generation! I'm excited to see so many of our youth bringing friends to church and a large number of our youth engaging their friends in conversations about the gospel. If you think this younger generation is hopeless, you're wrong. They're poised for a great revival. Pray that they see genuine examples of what it means to follow Jesus. Pray that God will show them what a personal relationship with Him is really all about.
