that attempt to define its ministry and identity. Just this week, I have had conversations with others concerning legal and ethical dilemmas we are facing in our churches. Whether it is confronting abusive behaviors in our communities, wrestling with humanistic philosophies within the church, or simply seeking to promote God's intentional design of marriage and gender to our families, we are experiencing new challenges. To be quite honest, I never believed that we would face such things; but such is the reality of the day. Instead of retreating from the difficult issues, it is incumbent upon us to present solid, biblical perspectives while ministering in wisdom and grace. Yes, we are charged with pointing people to Christ in the midst of challenging times! And even though I may grow disheartened with such cultural upheaval, I also find myself encouraged. Why? Let me suggest a few reasons for confidence.

First, God's character and His Word do not change. We can rely upon the sure principles of the Lord to remain firm. That constancy allows me to navigate through the cultural waters with a definite message of life and hope.

Second, the power of the Gospel is still transformative today. The good news of Jesus Christ still changes people today. It impacts their lives and destinies as nothing else can. Thus, every
