The Pastor's Perspective Dr. Reggie Bridges

For the past few years, our Temple family has joined Samaritan's Purse in what we call Operation Christmas Child. The stated mission of Operation Christmas Child is "to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way to needy children around the world, and together with the local church worldwide, to share the Good News of Jesus Christ." Individually, we pack small shoeboxes with school supplies, hygiene items, toys, and personal notes that will be delivered to children around the world. Small, simple shoeboxes designed for eternal impact. Doesn't seem possible, does it? Well, let me assure you that it is possible!

A few years, I entered into *the gathering* service and was greeted by Mrs. Vivian Magee. Of course, we exchanged greetings and then she shared with me a story about the young lady who accompanied her in church that day. Mrs. Vivian told me that her worship companion had actually received an Operation Christmas Child shoebox as a child overseas, and later she had filled a shoebox to send. I was astounded to hear how God had not only used a shoebox to minister to a young child in the past but also how He moved upon that same heart years later to continue a cycle of ministry. I recounted this extraordinary incident to the congregation during

As you could imagine, I was overwhelmed at God's confirmation of ministry. My sense of gratitude only multiplied later that evening as I discovered that at least four other children within our church had benefited from Operation Christmas Child before they were adopted and brought to the United States.

I say it again. Small, simple shoeboxes can have an eternal impact. And thanks to your faithfulness, we are sending over 600 such ministry boxes to children all over the globe. I've learned from much personal experience that babies are not always excited to have changes. Everyone in a 50 ft radius can know that the baby needs to be changed, but still that baby does not want it to happen. Babies don't really see the need to be changed, and they may even fight against the change. If you've ever tried changing a baby who has transformed into a something that is eerily similar to a crocodile doing the "death roll" because it just caught its next meal, you know that babies can take a stinky situation to a whole new level of messiness that requires a whole box of wipes! The crying, screaming, gagging, rolling, and flinging are borderline impressive - and the baby can get upset too!

Too often, I think Christians fight against change that God wants to make in our lives. Teenagers (and adults too) can usually tell you exactly what changes they need to make in their relationships with God, but they still fight against those changes instead of fighting to make those changes happen. Many times, Christians make a bigger mess than needed before we allow God to make the necessary changes in our lives.

I love seeing when real change takes place. I love seeing a teenager really and truly follow Jesus Christ in life-changing and contagious ways. One event where I get to see this on a regular basis is Princess & Warrior Weekend. This event allows teenagers to get biblical answers for their tough questions from incredible leaders in an environment that encourages real change. We have extreme amounts of fun at this retreat, but everything about Princess & Warrior Weekend is designed to see God radically change the lives of teenagers.
