# The Pastor's Perspective Dr. Reggie Bridges

When God allows His people to gather collectively for worship, it is a powerful moment. Indeed, we are promised that our Lord is present where "two or three" are together in His name. This means that there is a special manifestation of His presence in and among us! Furthermore, such a gathering allows us to "rub souls" with one another. Our spirits connect as His Spirit hovers over us and brings us together. And for just a few moments each week, we have an opportunity to extend a gracious welcome to those around us. So, in particular, we need to make the most of that effort.

This week, I read some comments by Edward T. Welch that helped me think through my practice of extending hospitality to those around me. Welch writes:

Greetings, of course, take time. This means our greeting list might be short, because we have a finite amount of time when the church is gathered . . . we cannot greet everyone. So here is how we prioritize:

- The visitor (what Scripture calls the 'foreigner' or 'alien') comes first.
- The visitor who returns comes next.
- The less popular, the introverts, the marginalized, or those sitting alone come next.
- Then come the children. Jesus singles them out as examples of the marginalized.


