The Pastor's Perspective Dr. Reggie Bridges

After warning the Northern Kingdom of Israel of impending To be honest, news reports may capture the world's landscape consequences for its sin, the prophet Isaiah turned his attention to a more hopeful message. You can practically feel the pivot in his fortieth chapter as spirits are lifted and confidence is encouraged. Many biblical students appropriately refer to the rest of Isaiah's work (chapters 40-66) as "The Book of Comfort" or "The Book of Hope." A familiar passage drives home this theme:

Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Everlasting God, the Lord, the Creator of the ends of the earth does not become weary or tired. His understanding is inscrutable. He gives strength to the weary, and to him who lacks might He increases power. Though youths grow weary and tired, and vigorous young men stumble badly. Yet those who wait for the Lord will gain new strength. They will mount up with wings like eagles, they will run and not get tired, they will walk and not become weary.... Do not fear, for I am with you; Do not anxiously look about you, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, surely I will help you, surely I will uphold you with My righteous right hand" (Isaiah 40:28-31, 41:10 NAS).

Comfort! Hope! Assurance! Encouragement! How the Israelites needed that message after seeing the difficulty around them! And how we still need it!

Panic and fear encompass the globe right now. From the outbreak associated with the coronavirus to financial uncertainty in our economy, people are paralyzed with fright. Terms like quarantine, pandemic, community spread and mortality rate frequent our lips . . . words that we rarely had used even six weeks ago. And as the disease continues its sprawl across the continents, more anguish will follow.

right now, but they fail to present the whole picture. It is even more bleak when you look more closely around us. Friends of ours here in the community are battling cancer, heart disease, Parkinson's, etc. Others are seeing marriages struggle. Some are attempting to minister to their spouses, children, and even grandchildren as dementia and depression affect their mental health. Still, there are those who are experiencing spiritual doubt and are poised to turn their backs on the one true God. These are difficult days with heavy issues! No doubt!

But circle back to Isaiah's declaration of encouragement with me: "Do not fear, for I am with you." My friends, God has not abandoned us! He is with us through these moments. And when we grow weary and are ready to give up, He provides supernatural strength to us! Yes, we need to be wise in our work. (For example, we are following the State Department advisories as well as the International Mission Board's recommendations as we evaluate upcoming trips.) But we must not forget our God is above every disease and struggle. In fact, I would encourage you to stop and pray that our Lord would stop this coronavirus and protect His people. Be bold! Sometimes, we have not because we ask not. So ask! In addition, pray for those around us who are struggling physically, relationally, mentally, and most importantly, spiritually. He is the One Who brings healing and hope!

Lastly, don't forget that God is still working. Our college ministry team just returned from Panama City Beach where they recorded 459 gospel conversations! Hallelujah! This is a great time to tell people good news—Jesus! So let's be about it! See you Sunday!




