"But we, brethren, having been taken away from you for a short There are a lot of uncertainties as to when we might gather time in presence, not in heart, endeavored more eagerly to see your face with great desire" (1 Thessalonians 2:17 NKJV). Never before have Paul's words resonated in my life like they do right now. How I long to see you, my faith family! I'm grateful for the technological advancements that allow us to maintain some connection as a church body, but I also know that an online/electronic presence is not the same as the people of God gathering together collectively and physically. As one pastor noted, "These [current] efforts are not a replacement for the gathered church but a supplement for the scattered church. The situation we face keeps us spiritually hungry; this temporary and limited provision stops us from spiritually starving." There can be no true comparison between feasting together and scavenging separately. We devour the scraps now knowing that we shall return to the banquet table with our spiritual family at some point!

With that being said, God has transformed the impossible into the possible. In the past couple of weeks alone, more of God's Word seems to have been pushed out on social media platforms than ever before. Services are streaming, and lives are still being changed. Just this last Sunday, we had a couple of visitors fill out "communication card" through the livestream service. Moreover, many of you have taken advantage of resources like Facebook and Zoom to continue your Sunday School class. One specific class reported 28 members present along with 2 guests! How awesome! Even the slower pace has enabled some of you to do more Bible reading and reflection daily. I'm telling you that the church's worship and study continue!
