both my mind and my heart. In fact, I am convinced that God has been reinforcing its truth to me. And how I have needed to hear it! Like many of you, I feel like I enrolled in a new course, RL405 REASON AND LOGIC. And the assignments that go along with it? Well, wow! It takes day and night to complete the workload. My mind refuses to rest, and instead, insists on thinking through various issues and scenarios before it. How do we safely return to on-campus, small group Bible study? What will church look like in six months? How can we continue to connect with to our congregation? How do we speak for biblical truth without being perceived as political in an emotionally-charged society? What are some ways we can show love to individuals struggling with self-isolation? How can we minister to the sick when we can't visit hospitals, rehabs, nursing homes? How do we empower all generations to serve effectively when specific age groups are not even comfortable returning to campus for months more? Will international mission trips be possibilities in 2021? What? How? If? When? Where? So? Who?

Hear my mental exercises as I assess, reason, seek, formulate? Sure, you do. And while your questions may not center around the church per se, I believe many of you feel like my classmates in RL405 REASON AND LOGIC. You have been trying to contemplate school, work, and family. Questions abound as to what life may look like for you over the next few months. You have made plans, only to see those logistics change. Nothing appears constant.

I can attest to the fact that people are struggling mentally and spiritually. While COVID-19 has presented severe physical ramifications for individuals, it has also contributed to a mental deterioration to individuals and families. We, as a staff, have witnessed a substantial increase in requests for counseling. I've personally seen some of our senior adults lose more of their faculties because of social isolation itself. I've prayed with fellow believers who are combating severe depression. I've visited with individuals who have experienced

"Faith is reason at rest." Recently, the statement has echoed in strained relationships. I've talked with law enforcement officers and medical personnel who are burned out. And while these things happen outside of pandemic life, I sincerely hold that this coronavirus has directly attacked the mental and spiritual health of people in our church and community. You see, we need to reason through our approach to physical health, but we must also take into consideration how people are suffering on a different level and help them find rest.

> Perhaps just as importantly, we need to allow reason to rest in our own lives. I'm not saying we shouldn't plan. The old adage is correct: "If you fail to plan, you plan to fail." And these days, my brother, George, has reminded us that we don't just need Plan A and Plan B; we also need Plan C, Plan D, and Plan E! However, sometimes we need to allow our reasoning ability to rest . . . in Him! This past Sunday, I observed that plagues can remind us how truly human we are and how truly God He is. Daily, I understand that. We are making plans for resuming Sunday School, children's activities, and so much more; but much is dependent upon where we are in the next few weeks. And to be honest, I am frustrated that I can't control those things. I can't bring the coronavirus case count down on my own. I can't stop the spread by myself. But I do know the ONE Who can! And I must rest in Him no matter what the future brings!

> Would you join me in **prayer** for **national**, **state**, **and local leaders** as they make decisions? Would you pray for **pastors** as they attempt to navigate these days? Would you pray for school superintendents, principals, university presidents, and teachers who are trying to figure out what to do in the fall? Would you lift up business owners, medical personnel, and all those who are seeking wisdom in how to proceed? And would you pray specifically for rest in Christ? Don't forget our Lord's invitation: "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." Let your reason rest in Him. After all, that truly is faith. Raising A College Kid - I recently read an article about the four phases of raising kids. Tim Elmore had this to say: **Four Phases of Raising Kids:**

As I have crossed paths with successful parents, several have confirmed that parenting is the ultimate picture of leadership. As we lead our kids, there are different phases where our leadership morphs into a new style, always loving but ever guiding the emerging adult.

- 1. **Discipline Phase** (Ages 1-5). This is when children learn boundaries.
- 2. **Training Phase** (Ages 6-12). This is when children learn to initiate good behavior.
- 3. Coaching Phase (Ages 13-21). This is when you guide their own decision making.
- 4. Friendship Phase (Ages 22 and up). This is when you enjoy the fruit of love and respect.

As I reflected on this upcoming Sunday and the high school seniors who will become incoming freshmen, I thought about how often parents leave the Coaching Phase and move straight to the Friendship Phase. Your kids' college years are some of the most foundational years in their lives. In these four short years, they develop thinking skills, relationship skills, and faith skills which will last a lifetime. As a college staff, it is our prayer, that parents would continue to coach their kids in matters of faith so that they will develop great spiritual skills. Encourage your kids through this difficult transition. With our current COVID culture, kids need coaching more than ever. Encourage your kid to do three things in preparation for college.

- 1. **Pray and read God's Word daily.** I know it seems simple, but so is washing your hands and brushing your teeth after every meal.
- 2. **Become involved in a faith community.** We all have felt the effects of isolation. Faith isolation is also harmful.
- 3. **Embrace the challenge and change.** All of us have questions these days. Placing our plans and our future in God's hands is helpful and fruitful.

Keep coaching! The Friendship Phase will come, but it will be so much more sweeter if you guide your kids from the sidelines until the whistle blows.
