This past Sunday, we recognized our 2020 high school back to our church family. My friends, that is what we must be graduates, and we prayed for them as they enter into a new chapter of their lives. So, I am excited to hear of you all expanding to Delta and Grambling!" Wow! Isn't that awesome! A story of a young woman who saw her life transformed in Christ through the ministry of our church! You see, Maggie just graduated with her law degree from the University of Kansas, but she traces her discovery of purpose

about. We must be reaching students from pre-k all the way through graduate school! Of course, there is much uncertainty as to what the school year may look like, but in some creative ways, we have to help them grow in Christ.

I know many of us are rightly concerned about physical health right now, but our spiritual welfare is so important. In fact, much more significant! Think about it. Our Daily lives totally disrupted in order to protect our family, friends, neighbors, and even strangers . . . and again, they should be! Youth Ministry John Nugent God is Still at Work

What a crazy time it has been these last few months. There are moments when I get discouraged as I think about all the events and ministry that we had planned that ended up being canceled or postponed. No mission trip to Boston or Austin. Our youth worship services have been postponed at least until August.

I've wondered how many people are being affected spiritually. We had over 100 students go on a mission trip and experience God outside of their normalcy last year. How can we make up for those lost experiences this summer? And what about the people with whom we would have worked? How will they hear the Gospel? How will church plants and ministry centers in our partner cities get the help they need that we would have provided?

As I wonder and stress about these things, God is at work. I'm reminded how insignificant I am and how my plans are not what God needs. Our church plant partners have been sending in news of ways they have been able to minister and reach out to their communities that they would have never been able to do under normal circumstances. Sure, there are still difficult circumstances, but we are hearing some God-sized stories from so many of our mission partners. During all this quarantine craziness, we've had two of our youth baptized; and we have three more waiting right now for baptism!

One of our students told his Sunday School teacher that he felt like he needed to start sharing his faith but didn't really know where to start. He thought our mission trip to Austin would be a great way to take advantage of some opportunities to share the Gospel and his story. Obviously, he was upset when the Austin mission trip was canceled and was sharing his disappointment with a neighbor friend. His neighbor had never heard him talk much about his faith and naturally started to ask a few questions. Last Sunday, this student was able to bring this friend to church and realized that there are opportunities to share the Gospel and see God work that are in front of us all the time. Please pray that this friend will come to know Christ as these conversations continue!

I thought God was less at work because my plans were canceled and my normal ministry routine has been upended, but God is not dependent on my plans or expectations. He is always at work. He is at work in big ways. He does not change even when my circumstances do. What an amazing God we know and serve!
