Let God Use What You Already Have: Jesus had a large crowd pressing in on Him, and He wanted to be able to teach them. So He used Peter's boat (Luke 5:1-3). Jesus didn't come for the righteous but for the sinners, so He called Matthew and used Matthew's friendships to introduce Himself to sinners who needed Him (Matthew 9:9-13). Somebody, whose name we don't know, had an upper room that Jesus used to teach His disciples and have the Last Supper with them (Luke 22:10-13). There are many more times that Jesus uses someone's donkey, influence, and many other things for His glory. What do you have that Jesus is using?

Too often, teenagers are waiting to obtain something, grow old enough, or arrive at some point in life before they feel like they can be used by God.
