These are men and women who place their lives on the line daily to protect our families and communities. They deserve our support and encouragement in Christ. I urge you to pray for those who serve in such capacities and express your appreciation to them through tangible acts of kindness. After all, the beloved disciple commanded, "Little children, let us love not with word or with tongue, but in deed and Never forget that! And I'll see you soon!

I am also thankful that your love spills over into our state, national, and even international missions. Already, you have contributed over \$16,000 to our Georgia Barnette State Missions Offering, funds which undergird the disaster relief response as well as the church planting endeavors right here in Louisiana. In many ways, this offering is the lifeblood of such ministries, and we look forward to reaching and exceeding our church goal of \$28,000 so that we can impact our state for Christ.

Does it really say that? I'll never forget the inscription written on the side of some of the police cars in our East Asian city several years ago. It read, "to punish and enslave." This was the message the police department in this East Asian city wanted to communicate to their people! A few months later, I compared that to the message on the police car in a small town in Mississippi. It read, "to serve and protect." I'll never forget the contrast in the two messages and the meaning of the words from each. I believe it is with that spirit that most of our law enforcement officers sign up to serve their communities.

On Thursday, we hosted our third **LoveLincoln** event of the year as we blessed local law enforcement in Lincoln Parish! We had over 50 volunteers from Temple join together to serve those who serve on our behalf. We prepared over 150 meals and notecards, and delivered them to police departments in Choudrant, Dubach, Grambling, Ruston, Simsboro, as well as the Sheriff's department and Marshal's office. We also took them to the campus police departments at Grambling State University and Louisiana Tech University. We were able to speak an encouraging word to them, pray over them, thank them for their work, and speak about the One who gave His life for us so that we could have life!
