# *Our plan, God's way* Make plans — not resolutions — for 2020

"A man's mind plans his way, but the Lord directs his steps and makes them sure. (Prov. 16:9; Ps. 37:23; Prov. 20:24; Jer. 10:23)

Have you made plans or even resolutions in the past that never came to pass? Perhaps you didn't follow through yourself, or things just didn't work out. If so, make the decision today that you're finished with fixing your mind on things that are in the past — things that you have repented about, that have been erased by the blood of Jesus, and that you can't do anything about now.

You have the power right now to turn away from yesterday and start focusing on what is in front of you today. Yesterday is a done deal! The clock cannot be turned back. Living in regret will only keep you from moving forward into the future.

If you've been thinking about the promises you made to yourself that you've broken, it's time to leave it all behind and say hello to the fabulous future that lies before you!

So, let's not focus on resolutions so much as plans themselves. We have all made plans — day to day plans, vacation plans, and heart longing plans. Perhaps there is a special plan in your heart right now and you are all excited and just know your special hope and plan must be God's plan for you as well. But then you are overwhelmed by circumstances which seem to refute the validity of your plan and doubt rears its ugly head.

This is when we know we need to begin seeking God in prayer. Because He holds the future, and who else are you going to trust? Through praying, reading God's Word and listening to the Spirit's prompting, you find that God will never leave you in doubt. Through prayer, study and patience, you can be sure that in His time He will reveal "His Plan," and His plan will be the best plan!

As you begin meditating, praying and studying, three things come to mind. Is your own plan not coming to pass, are you listening to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, are you struggling with doubt, or is your belief level just wavering? This is where God's Word comes into play.

Your plan is like a seed sown in the ground, and you began to water it with the Word of God. God's Word is impregnated with life, wisdom, truth, power, and potential.

Remember, God only had to say, "Let there be" and it was. Every Word He speaks contains the power to create, and every promise He makes contains the seeds of its own fulfillment. Seeds, of course, have a scheduled season for fullfillment in your life and when they are watered with confident, faith-filled prayer, standing equally on the Scriptures and patiently awaiting God's timing — His Word cannot fail.

Once you grasp this truth, the words you say become loaded! Speaking them aloud releases God's blessing and fullfillment into your life. Jesus said "Whosoever says to this mountain, 'Be removed and be cast into the sea,' and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that those things he says will be done, he will have whatever he says."

Jesus continued by saying "Therefore I say to you, whatever you ask when you pray, believe that you receive them and you will have them." (Mark 11:23-24 NKJV) Notice that this Scripture deals with your mountain (your plan), what you say, your doubts and your ability to believe.

So, when discouragement has taken such a strong hold of your heart that you can't imagine a way out of your circumstances, remember your plan and ask the Holy Spirit for His help. The Holy Spirit will supply you with the ability to know God's will and what he is saying. Then not only will He show you what to do, He will empower you to do it and He will bring you into remembrance of the power of God revealed in His Word.

Don't make the mistake of thinking that because you don't know all you would like to know or you're not making the progress you wish for that nothing is happening. Something is happening right now. Your faith is being stretched, your patience is being developed, your doubts are being confronted and conquered, and you own relationship with God is growing deeper.

The Scriptures reveal that He always prepares us in advance for what He has planned ahead for us. Why? Because it matters to God what you become on the way to where you are going. God is using this journey to teach you faith, refine your character, and equip you for challenges of the future.

**Prayer**: Holy Father, I thank You for Your awesome power that You have chosen to share with Your children. I don't even have to let evil circumstances run freely in my life. By opening my mouth and speaking the Word of God to my situation, Your power can be released to obliterate the enemy's work in my life. Thank you that you are with me even in times of desperation. Thank you for making me Your joint heir and for investing Your great power into my life. Thank you that when I cry out to you, I know you hear me. In Jesus' name, Amen.
